Feedback from Reception and Year 1 Survey

Following on from the two surveys sent out regarding the changes to Reception and Year One for the summer term, I would like to provide some feedback and to talk about our next steps.

We received twelves responses to the week one survey and ten responses for the week two survey. As both surveys were identical, I am providing highlights of the week two survey outlined below, but, please be aware these figures are based on 10 respondents out of 27.

- 100% of children are happy to come to school.
- 80% of children have settled in to new routines (20% recorded a neutral answer for this).
- 100% feel their children are getting access to their learning.
- 70% are enjoying being with their peers (20% recorded a neutral answer for this, 10% said the class is too noisy).
- 100% are aware of improvements outside Reception/Year 1.
- 90% know that Reception children return to the unit for afternoon learning.
- 100% are aware of some or all of the structure.
- 60% disagree to children returning to previous classes, (30% do want children to return to previous classes, 10% neutral answer for this).

Having reviewed the survey results I would like, to reassure you that we are looking at how to minimise noise levels, by making even more use of the EYFS unit and outdoor space during good weather. In terms of the feedback received and the number of responses to the survey, I feel it would not be appropriate to move the children back in to their previous classes, as the overwhelming majority appear well settled and happy in their current class. From a transition point of view I feel that this will be really beneficial as I am shortly due to announce the staffing structure for 2024/25 which includes a mixed Year 1 and Year 2 class. That being said, I am mindful of, and do take on board any concerns and would like to invite in any families who would like to discuss this decision further, as I want you to be happy with the education your child is receiving, which includes the location they are being taught in.

I would like to thank you all for your support during this period of transition and a big thank you must go to the teaching staff who ensure your children are loving their learning each day. Thank you as well for the kind comments and offers of support which have included parents providing equipment for the outdoor area including tyres and cable wheels. We are still waiting for furniture to be delivered which has been delayed due to unforeseen circumstances.
